State Provides: Tables, chairs, social distance signs, CDE signs, hand sanitizer, and sanitation wipes/spray.

Team Provides (if needed): Clipboard, blank paper, non-programmable calculator, and a pencil.

All team members will be required to wear a mask, covering their nose and mouth, during the duration of CDEs.

Participants will be using scantrons for this event. A sample copy of the scantron is available on the Utah FFA website. Please familiarize your competitors with the scantron prior to the event. Errors made by contestants in completing the scantron WILL NOT result in their scores being changed or fixed.

Contest Details

1. Teams will be assigned a time.
 - a. 5 teams from 8:00 a.m. - 10:00 a.m.
 - b. Cleaning Break from 10:00 a.m. - 10:30 a.m.
 - c. 5 teams from 10:30 a.m. - 12:30 p.m.

2. Teams need to arrive 30 minutes before their scheduled time for registration, so the event can start promptly at 8:00 a.m. and 10:30 a.m.
3. Teams that miss their scheduled time slots in the rotation will not be given the opportunity to present or compete at another time. If a team's schedule changes they will be notified by an event coordinator.
4. All teams/contestants need to enter the building through the North West Door to check in for the event.
5. Team members will be at the event for an extended time period. They are encouraged to bring water and snacks if they desire as long as the food and drink stays in designated areas.

Please note the following modifications:

Event Rules

Dress Code: FFA Jackets are NOT required or recommended for this event and should not be worn. Competitors should wear a scrub top and any type of pants. This event works with live animals so getting dirty is a good possibility. All participants must wear closed toe, closed heel and flat shoes (no clogs, sandals or flip-flops). No jewelry may be worn. This includes rings, bracelets, earrings, and exposed body piercing. Wrist watches are permitted.

Tools & Equipment: Each contestant is responsible to bring their own: pencils, non-programmable, calculator, clipboards, scratch paper. Only a clean clipboard and blank paper is allowed.

Cell phones or other electronic communication devices or devices capable of being programmed may not be used as calculators and are not allowed in the event. Contestants found using any communication or program able device will be disqualified.

Event Format

A. Individual Activities

1. Current Events - **This activity will NOT be conducted.**
2. Identification (100 pts total) - 20 questions/30 minutes to complete
 - Equipment 10 items/5 points (50 points total)

- Parasites/Microscope 6 items/5 points (30 points total)
- Breeds 4 items/5 points (20 points total)

3. Practicums

- Handling & Restraining Practicum (120 pts total) - Contestants will be required to do 2 of the following 7 practicums. The specific 2 practicums will not be released prior to the event.
 1. Restraint of Cat in Lateral Recumbency for Femoral Venipuncture
 2. Removing Dog from Floor Level Cage to Restrain for Lateral Saphenous Venipuncture
 3. Restraint of a rabbit
 4. Haltering Ruminants
 5. Haltering a Horse
 6. Placing a Tail Tie
 7. Applying Elizabethan collar
- Clinical Procedure Practicum (200 pts total) - Contestants will be required to do 2 of the following 7 practicums. The specific 2 practicums will not be released prior to the event.
 1. Administer Aural Medication
 2. Administering Ophthalmic Medication
 3. Filling a Syringe for Injection
 4. Prepare a Surgical Pack for Sterilization
 5. Prescription Filling
 6. Removal of Sutures
 7. Administer Oral Tablet/Capsule

B. Team Activity (500 pts Total)

This event will be conducted according to the description/rules provided in the National CDE Handbook. Note that all presentation equipment is to be provided by the team. No computerized presentations at all. **Each team will have 15 minutes to prepare, 10 minutes to present, and 5 minutes to answer questions from the judge.** The activity topic is:
